Tramaglini – Employment of Superintendent

RESOLUTION #8: Introduced by G. Laudati, who moved its adoption, seconded by Jankiewicz, Be It Resolved, That the Kenilworth Board of Education appoints Dr. Thomas Tramaglini as Superintendent of Schools, beginning February 16, 2016, for a four-year, four and one half month term ending June 30, 2020 at a starting salary of \$145,000, plus the \$2,500 high school salary increment provided by law and subject to further negotiations of contract terms. The Board authorizes the Board President and the Business Administrator / Board Secretary to negotiate the terms and conditions of a contract, which will be prepared by counsel and is subject to the review and approval of the Executive County Superintendent as required by law. Motion carried 8-0-1. Voting yes was: Braun, Curtin, David, Drogon, Jankiewicz, A. Laudati, G. Laudati and Zimmerman. Abstaining was: Duda.

- Introduction of Dr. Thomas Tramaglini as Superintendent of Schools. Dr. Tramaglini spoke to the Board and the public, thanking them for their support and expressing his excitement to be the next educational leader of the Kenilworth Public Schools.
- President David thanked the Search Committee: Mr. Curtin, Mrs. Zimmerman, Mr. A. Laudati and Mr. Gonnella. He also thanked Mr. Gonnella's staff, Connie Stavros, Lisa Casamento, Maryellen Duggan and Roseann Rinaldi for their behind-the-scene efforts.

Finance & Facilities: Anthony Laudati, Chairperson.

• The administrators have been working on their portions of the 2016-2017 budgets. They were due to Mr. Gonnella today. The Finance Committee will be reviewing them in January.

- Mr. Bolcar and Mr. Gonnella met with the Executive County Superintendent, Dr. Roger Jinks, last week for the Mid-Year Budget review. They reported that everything went well and had a nice discussion with Dr. Jinks and his staff about facilities, the Superintendent Search process and the financial challenges of Special Education.
