#### Qualitative (2)

- Professional Development In 2017-2018, a Board approved teacher-driven revision of the district's professional development plan will be redesigned for implementation in September 2018. Percentage Merit- 2.5%
- 2) Early Childhood Expansion A framework for early childhood education (birth through kindergarten) will be developed and implemented via community stakeholders. The district will work collaboratively with various community organizations (e.g., library) to establish a framework of expectations of skills in what the district expects students to bring to kindergarten. The goal of this effort will be to educate our parents and guardians of what they need to do before their children reach school. The layout of the program will be focused on an expansion of our current program to focus on student achievement at the earliest time we can access students. Percentage Merit- 2.5%

#### Quantitative (3)

- 1) Student performance in grades 3 through 6 in English language arts on the Map assessment will improve at least 75% of the students in grades 3 through 6 will meet or exceed the RIT score (at least 1 indicating positive growth) from the fall to the spring administrations. Percentage Merit- 3.33%
- 2) Student performance in grades 3 through 6 in mathematics on the Map assessment will improve at least 75% of the students in grades 3 through 6 will meet or exceed the RIT score (at least 1 indicating positive growth) from the fall to the spring administrations. Percentage Merit- 3.33%
- 3) Student performance in grades 7 through 8 in mathematics on the Map assessment will improve at least 70% of the students in grades 7 through 8 will meet or exceed the RIT score (at least 1 indicating positive growth) from the fall to the spring administrations. Percentage Merit- 3.33%
