RESOLUTION #2: Introduced by David, who moved its adoption, seconded by Laudati, Be It Resolved that the Kenilworth Board of Education appoint Brian Luciani as Acting Superintendent retroactive to May 3, 2018, through June 30, 2018 with a stipend of \$1,000/month, subject to the execution of an agreement approved by the Executive County Superintendent of Schools, and available for renewal as provided by law.

Motion was made by David, seconded by Drogon, that when the meeting adjourns, it adjourns to the call of the chair. Motion carried unanimously.
