Superintendent's Report & Presentations

- 1. I'd like to thank the twenty parents who attended April's Special Education Parent Advisory Group (SEPAG) last Monday. Thank you to our CST member Mrs. Carrara who presented on the continuum of services through the lens of an IEP. An additional thank you to parent Mrs. Colon for also presenting on the rights of parents in special education. I will be making public all of these presentations from the night soon.
- 2. I'd like to give my congratulations to the cast and crew of *The Addams Family*. I had the opportunity to see the play on Saturday and was reminded of how important the opportunities we give to students in all areas of our educational program are. If you couldn't make it, but are still in need of some theater experiences for the month April, I encourage you to attend this Thursday's performance of *Peter Pan* at Harding Elementary School.

- 3. This evening you'll be approving the resignation of Margaret Greten for reasons of retirement. Meg has been a teacher for us in Kenilworth beginning in September of 1993. I'd like to recognize and congratulate her for her more than 25 years of service to our district. Meg, I wish you good health and happiness in your retirement.
- 4. As a result of only having used two emergency snow days, we will follow the approved 18-19 school year calendar and have a day off of school on Friday, May 24, 2019 as a give-back day.
- 5. This evening we have 2 presentations, the first of which is entitled: Tails for Tales. We are pleased to continue Harding's reading incentive program for the third year in a row. Tails for Tales is a homegrown program that partners the Kenilworth School District with The Bright and Beautiful Therapy Dog organization. The goal of the program is to encourage our students to read at home. Classes that reach reading goals are entered into a monthly drawing to win a visit from Ms. Smith and one of her therapy dogs. For more information, I'm going to turn-it-over to Principal Murphy and our Supervisor of Curriculum and Instruction, Ms. Cansian.
- 6. I'm honored to have the privilege of introducing this year's Educators of the Year. Through this state-sponsored program, each teacher and educational specialist was nominated by a group of their teaching and administrative peers. When reviewing their bios and accomplishments in district, I'm reminded of the idea proffered by reading guru Richard Allington who asserted that while programs and resources and class sizes matter, they don't matter as much as teachers. He points out that "in the end it will be teachers who make the difference in children's school lives. It's teachers who will either lead the change or resist and stymie it." Our group of teachers' recognition here tonight serves as a reminder that this is a group of change agents who are committed to growing their own professional practice and serving the needs of our students. Teaching, as some of you know, is a labor of love. It's tiresome, work-laden and forever changing. While all teachers ought to be recognized for their vocational commitment, I'm honored to recognize tonight's cadre of five:
- Michael Klimchak, Harding Teacher of the Year. Michael is a 5th grade teacher at Harding Elementary. His tenure here began in 2008. He has helped develop curriculum as a curriculum writer for us and also served as a Family Math teacher. He was also the recipient of our 2012 Teacher of the Year Award.
- Nancy Bechtler, David Brearley Middle School Teacher of the Year. Nancy began in the Kenilworth Schools in 1997. She is a special education teacher. She has been the Co-Chair of the Academic Mentoring Committee, coordinated the toy drive, food drive, annual gardening day, and heavenly hats drive. She's been a curriculum writer, I&RS coordinator and student government advisor. In 1999, she was recognized as the Teacher of the Year.

- Anthony LaBruno, David Brearley High School Teacher of the Year. Anthony began here in Kenilworth in 2012 as a Teacher of Music. Anthony has been the Spring Music Festival Coordinator for the Morris Union Jointure Commission. He's served as the middle school band director, assistant musical director, and a curriculum writer.
- Regina O'Connor, Educational Services Professional of the Year for Harding Elementary School. Regina is a Speech Language Specialist who began in Kenilworth in 2007. She's been a professional development presenter for us, an extended school year Speech Therapist and a parent training night presenter.
- Finally, Megan Harrison, Educational Professional of the Year for David Brearley Middle-High School. Meg is a school counselor who began here in 2014. She serves as a peer advisor, helps coordinate our PSAT parent night, has been a new teacher orientation presenter, and is a co-advisor to our Race Matters Student Alliance.
